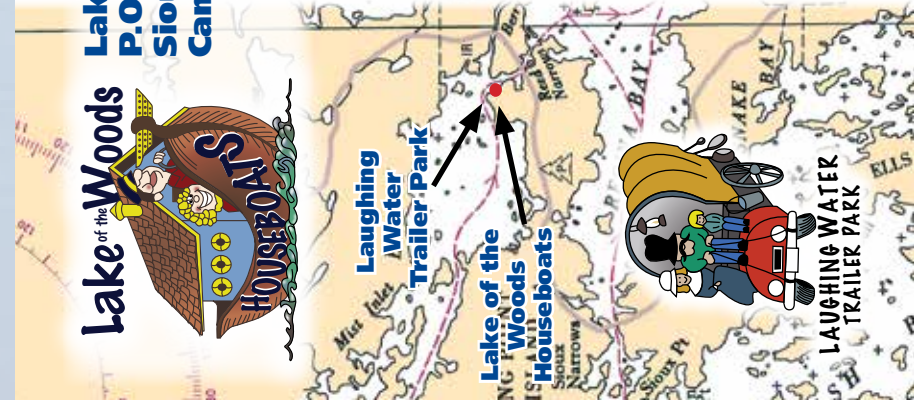

Each week we make a lake run to all of our houseboats in order to help with any problems or replenish supplies at your request.

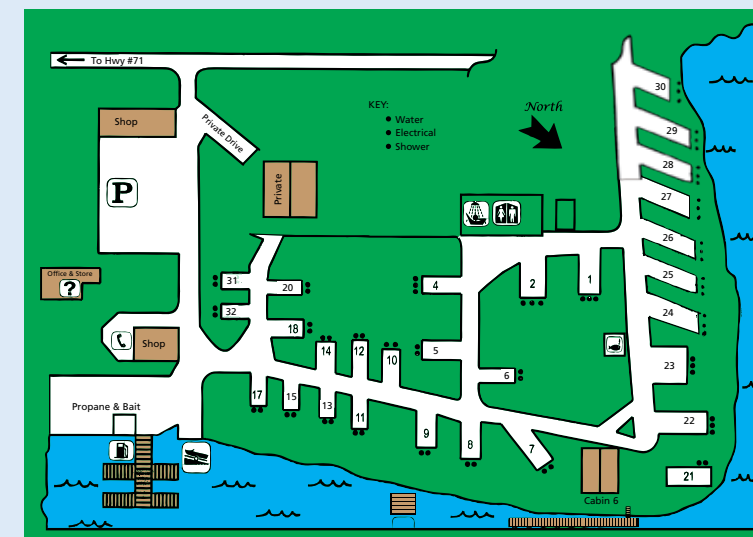
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Laughing Water Trailer Park is located on the peninsula four miles north of Sioux Narrows, Ontario, in sight of Reed Narrows Bridge and the entrance to bass water, Berry Creek. The quiet bay behind the point leads directly to Long Bay on the left and Regina Bay on the right. This is a prime location for easy access to fishing waters. We know that campers like their sites natural, so we have maintained the beauty of the setting. We have hot showers, flush toilets, laundry facilities, a screened fishhouse, firewood, freezer service, gasoline, bait, ice, fishing/hunting licenses, small convenience store, play area, horseshoes and a dock for your convenience. A launching ramp is provided for your boat. We have excellent boats and motors for rent and guides are available on adequate notice. Pets are welcome, but must be tied and supervised at all times - of course, we ask you to pick up after them. Limit of two per site or cabin. (NO EXCEPTIONS)



Cabin Six . . . Large cedar cottage with two separate bedrooms and three double beds. The living area has a sofa bed for extra sleeping space. Full bath, screened porch.

Camp site . . . Due to the great demand for natural, unspoiled tenting and camping areas; Laughing Water Trailer Park has created a relaxed atmosphere. Our sites are spaced to provide outdoor enjoyment with privacy. Most sites are located on Lake of the Woods shoreline, all others are within walking distance.



Travel information . . . From the south go west from Fort Frances on Highway 11, 30 miles to Highway 71 North. Turn north and travel 60 miles to Sioux Narrows. Our base is 4 miles north of Sioux Narrows on Laughing Water Road. From the north take the Trans Canada 15 miles east of Kenora to Highway 71 South. Turn south and travel 30 miles to just outside of Sioux Narrows. Our base is located on Laughing Water Road - first road to the right after the Reed Narrows Bridge.
